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

Outbound Programs

Student Exchange Program (Outbound)

- Over 500 HUFS students to 145 partner universities (as of 2018)
- Tuition fee waived at host institution

7+1 Study Abroad Program

- Over 600 HUFS students to 140 universities in the world (as of 2019)
- 7 semesters at HUFS, 1 semester abroad
- Tuition fee waived at HUFS
- Tuition discounts or scholarship opportunities at host institutions

Double Degree Program

- 2 years at HUFS & 2 years at host institutions
- Partners: Univ. of Delaware, SUNY Stony Brook, SUNY Oswego, National Taiwan Normal Univ.
- Tuition fee waived at HUFS
- Acquiring two degrees within four years

DBMD (Dual Bachelor's - Master's Degree) Program

- 3.5 year curriculum of undergraduate courses at HUFS & 1.5 year curriculum of advanced undergraduate and graduate courses at Temple University
- Tuition fee waived at HUFS for the first semester at Temple University
- Acquiring both bachelor's and master's degrees within five years

Inbound Programs

Student Exchange Program (Inbound)

- A total of 750 exchange students from 226 partner universities (as of 2019)
- Benefits for incoming exchange students
- a. Tuition fee waived at HUFS
- b. Intensive Korean language program offered

Visiting Student Program

 Students from non-partner universities can study at HUFS as fee-paying students for one semester or one academic year while receiving benefits equal to those of exchange students.

(1 semester fee: 3.500 USD)

Eligibilities

- Completed at least one semester at home university
- GPA: over 2.5 out of 4.0 (equivalent to B average)
- Meet the minimum level of language requirements (Korean: TOPIK 4 / English: TOEFL 80)

Learner-Centered Education System

- Intensive Korean Language Program: 4 terms (10 weeks each)
- Fall: Sept. 7 Nov. 19
- Winter: Dec. 7 Feb. 18
- Spring: Mar. 8 May 18
- Summer: Jun. 7 Aug. 13

Fees

- Registration fee: 60 USD
- Standard term (10 weeks): 1,600 USD
- For exchange students, Fall and Spring terms are offered free of charge.


