Academic Programs

Undergraduate and graduate courses in all subjects.

Mandarin Training Center (MTC)

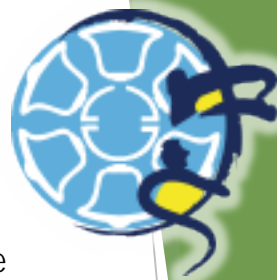
Non-Chinese-speaking students participating in Exchange Program are eligible to take "semester program" (group class) at MTC for up to **6 hours per week** without tuition.

Semester Program

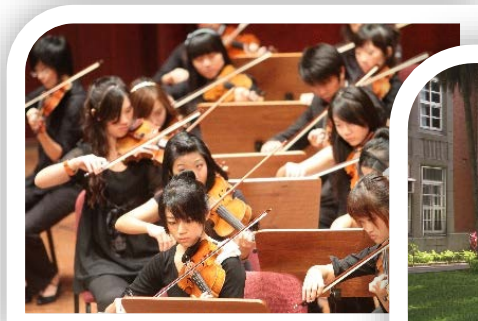
Support and Counseling

Visa Requirements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ For One-Semester Exchange Student Study LESS than 6 months: <u>VISITOR VISA</u>; then apply for extension within 15 days before the duration expired. ➤ For One-Academic-Year Exchange Student Study MORE than 6 months: <u>RESIDENT VISA</u>; then apply Alien Resident Certificates (ARC) within 15 days after arrival.
Medical Insurance	<p>All exchange students are required to purchase both overseas Accidental Insurance & overseas Medical Insurance. Each kind of insurance shall worth a minimum of NT\$1,000,000 (approx. US\$33,000) valid for the entire exchange period.</p> <p>From the 7th month of the stay, students are required to join National Health Insurance (NHI) of Taiwan according to the laws.</p>
Approximate Living Cost	<p>Meal: NTD100~200 per meal Transportation: MRT-NTD20~65, BUS-NTD15~45, TAXI-from NTD90 Off-campus Housing: from NTD9,000 per month</p>

Applicant Eligibility

- Full-time students nominated by NTNU's contracted Partner Institutions
- Have completed at least 1 year of university work prior to participation in exchange
(Individual applications will not be processed.)
