## Information for incoming Erasmus+ Interns

Under Erasmus+, both compulsory and voluntary internships abroad can be carried out with financial support from the Erasmus+ program. Interns find an internship on their own in one of the countries participating in Erasmus+ and apply for Erasmus+ funding through their home university.

Please contact your university in advance, e.g. the Erasmus team there, for information on the funding requirements there.
