Guidelines for Progress Reports

Scope: 3–5 pages plus time schedule and bibliography

- 1. Cover sheet or letterhead
 - Name
 - Title of your doctoral project
 - Subject
 - Name(s) of your supervisor(s)
 - Funding period dates
- 2. Current status of your doctoral research
 - 2.1. Short summary of the goals and research questions of your doctoral project
 - 2.2. Progress made to date / results acheived

Which research steps have you completed (e.g., literature review, source analyses, experiments, preparation/implementation/evaluation of surveys)?
Which methods have you used?
Which results have you obtained? Please ensure these are directly related to your research questions.
Do the results suggest a need to revise or reconsider your research questions?
How far along are you with the writing process?

2.3. Work and time schedule

Have you deviated from the original/previous time schedule and if so, why? What are your next work steps and research goals/milestones? Time schedule detailing the individual steps required to complete your doctorate (in tabular format)

2.4. Academic network

How is your relationship and the quality of communication with your supervisor(s)? Contact/exchange with other (early-career) researchers (e.g., in colloquia, at conferences or workshops) References to your own publications

- 3. Information on your personal situation, if this is relevant to how your doctoral project is progressing
